

EXPRESSION OF QUANTITY

When we talk about expressions of quantity we have two options: to use them with countable nouns and to use them with non-countable nouns.

Examples:

- How much wine do you want? (Non-countable)
- Just a little. (Non-countable answer)
- How many friends do you have in Ecuador? (Countable)
- I have two close friends here in Ecuador. (Countable answer)

Note: When using non-countable nouns in a question use "how much".

Here are some examples money of non-countable nouns.

In the answer to a non-countable noun question use "there is" plus one of the following:

a little not too much just a little a lot (of) there isn't any

Note: When using countable nouns in a question use "how many".

Here are some examples of countable nouns:

people cars students, etc.

In the answer to countable noun questions use "there are" a lot (of) with one of the following: plenty of not many

For plural count nouns answer with one of the following:

a few not too many
