

### PLURAL NOUNS

In English in most cases it is very simple to form the plural form of a noun by adding "s" at the end of the noun.

#### Examples:

```
car \rightarrow cars

table \rightarrow tables

cup \rightarrow cups
```

With nouns that end in s, ss, ch, sh, zz, o or x, "es" must be added at the end of the noun with some exceptions.

#### Examples:

```
bus \rightarrow buses

church \rightarrow churches Exceptions: stomach \rightarrow monarch

dish \rightarrow dishes

potato \rightarrow potatoes Exceptions: radio, piano, zoo

box \rightarrow boxes

fox \rightarrow foxes

buzz \rightarrow buzzes
```

But with singular nouns that end in "fe" or "f", the plural ending changes into "ves" with some exceptions.

#### Examples:

```
Wife \rightarrow wives Wolf \rightarrow wolves
Leaf \rightarrow leaves Thief \rightarrow thieves Exceptions: roof
```

For singular nouns that end in "y" preceded by a consonant, the final "y" changes into "ies" in the plural form.

#### Examples:

```
\begin{array}{ccc} \text{city} & \longrightarrow & \text{cities} \\ \text{country} & \longrightarrow & \text{countries} \\ \text{dictionary} & \longrightarrow & \text{dictionaries} \\ \text{secretary} & \longrightarrow & \text{secretaries} \end{array}
```

But when the final " $\mathbf{y}$ " is preceded by a vowel, only " $\mathbf{s}$ " is added to make the noun plural.

#### Examples:

$$\begin{array}{ll} boy \rightarrow boys & toy \rightarrow toys \\ city \rightarrow cities & secretary \rightarrow secretaries \end{array}$$

#### Grammar



Some nouns exist only in the singular or plural form.

Examples:

people are police are

news **is** family **is** bread **is** 

The following is a list of nouns that change in the plural form.

 $\begin{array}{ll} \text{Man} \rightarrow \text{men} & \text{person} \rightarrow \text{people} \\ \text{woman} \rightarrow \text{women} & \text{tooth} \rightarrow \text{teeth} \\ \text{goose} \rightarrow \text{geese} & \text{mouse} \rightarrow \text{mice} \\ \text{ox} \rightarrow \text{oxen} & \text{foot} \rightarrow \text{feet} \end{array}$ 

Here are some examples of nouns that have the same singular and plural form.

Examples:

Fish  $\rightarrow$  fish (one fish is) (some fish are)

 $trout \rightarrow trout$ 

 $deer \rightarrow deer$ 

means → means

species  $\rightarrow$  species
